Hennepin County Libraries hosted 18 Drag Queen Story Times for very young children in 2019, in spite of vocal public opposition. The stories celebrate and normalize LGBTQ and gender fluidity and the readers frequently behave sexually suggestively.

Adult erotic performers should not be allowed to influence and have close contact with innocent, impressionable children using public funds and buildings.

Since Drag Queen performances are sexually charged adult entertainment, public money should never subsidize programming that promotes them as role models for very young children.

More story times are expected in 2020.

Drag Queen Story Hours are not organic, spontaneous events, but well-coordinated, well-funded, and international.

They are beginning to be held in schools to further indoctrinate children into the ideology of sexual revolution.
