



## **Request for Child Protection League Presentation Comprehensive Sexuality Health Education**

The Child Protection League (CPL) is available to present information to local community groups on the topic of Comprehensive Sexuality Health Education (CSE). Presentation length is negotiable, depending upon the circumstances and the audience. The length is commonly 45 minutes to an hour, and we encourage extra time for Q&A because CSE presentations generate many questions.

In this presentation CPL provides information about the following:

- An overview of Comprehensive Sexuality Health Education (CSE) curriculum currently used in many school districts in Minnesota and how activist groups are privately pressuring non-participating school districts to include this curriculum;
- The CSE mandate which passed the MN House in 2019 but which was stopped in the MN Senate and which is again before the MN legislature in 2021. It would mandate CSE in all Minnesota public/charter schools overriding the authority of local school districts;
- CSE curriculum content examples which meet proposed legislative requirements; content currently used in many school districts around the country and in MN; and content that has already been mandated for ALL public schools in California;
- Definitions of CSE promotional language;
- Health, safety, and moral issues involving CSE including the T-zone for females;
- Planned Parenthood's (PP) role in promoting and lobbying for CSE mandates in all states; PP and other gender identity activist organizations' teaching access into the classroom that the proposed Minnesota CSE Legislation would allow;
- Examples showing how CSE promotes gender fluidity from pre-K to 12<sup>th</sup> grade;
- A description of "Transformational Education" and its implementation in secular educational circles;
- A brief history of "Transformational Education" and CSE;
- An overview of the national agenda being pushed in every state by Planned Parenthood and other promoters of CSE, such as the Sexuality Information & Educational Council of the United States (SIECUS) and Advocates for Youth based on their own documents;
- Suggestions for how citizens can respond to this radical and dangerous teaching.

Due to the content, we ask that minors not be present. Incredibly, Minnesota's Obscenity Exemption Statute permits Minnesota schools to show obscene material to minors if it is called "educational." Yet local media cannot show the same material, deeming it too offensive.

Technical needs: PowerPoint screen; projector; microphone unless a small gathering; podium.

Other needs: Display table for free informational material, for signing CEUs, and for optional book sales as acceptable to the host; overnight accommodations if drive time requires it.
